Lesson 2:	Salmon Habitat
Accompanying Film:	Healing Hiłsyaq <b>λ</b> is
Standard Alignment:	NGSS: 3.LS4.3
Lesson Overview:	The film Healing Hiłsyaq ${f\lambda}$ is addresses the decline in salmon populations and

the work being done to restore habitat in hopes of fostering a recovery of fish populations. This activity focuses on salmon habitat needs. Students will listen to a story about two different fish, one born in degraded habitat and the other born in a healthy habitat. Students will then draw a picture depicting a healthy stream habitat for salmon.
