**The Fine Print:** We strongly encourage all attendees to purchase tickets and make session reservations in advance. While some tickets may still be available for purchase during the festival, your chances of seeing the films you want are best if you reserve them well in advance. All venues are first-come, first-served. We can guarantee you a seat at one of the venues, but not necessarily at the one you prefer. If you are a Watershed, Yuba, or Creek Passholder, you can use your pass to reserve space at the sessions you plan to attend. You still need to arrive at the venue 15-30 min prior to the start time to be able to get a seat. If you do not arrive within 15 minutes of the start time, your space will no longer be considered reserved and may be opened up for other attendees. If you arrive at a full venue, please check with the volunteers at the door for available seating at other venues.

**For 23 years,** SYRCL's Wild & Scenic Film Festival (WSFF) has welcomed audiences to scenic Nevada City and Grass Valley in Nevada County, California for this annual event. We are excited for you to join us in person for the February 13-17 festivities. For those who cannot join us in person, we offer a virtual fest running Feb 13-23. To learn more about the virtual festival, go to **WSFF.EVENTIVE.ORG.** 

### **About the Sessions**

We have programmed 117 environmental and adventure films, including 14 world premieres, 7 U.S. premieres, 4 West Coast premieres, and 7 California premieres. You can view these adventure and environmental shorts and features in 30+ themed sessions – some of which you can watch online. This makes your experience a cinematic journey, as these sessions thoughtfully link subject matter, encouraging surprising connections.

#### What is a film session?

A film session is a grouping of films shown in blocks of approximately 2 - 2.5 hours. Some sessions may include elements such as a filmmaker panel, Q&A session, or introduction.



### **In-Person Screenings**

You must buy tickets in advance to guarantee a seat at each screening. If you are a Festival Passholder, you can use your pass to reserve space at the sessions you plan to attend.

IMPORTANT: even with a ticket/pass, you must arrive at the venue 15-30 min before the start time to guarantee your seat. If you do not arrive within 15 minutes of the start time, your empty seat will be considered open for those waiting in the "rush line" to buy last-minute tickets.

A **Watershed Pass** allows you to have a pre-reserved seat for the sessions you attend. To have a pre-reserved seat for a given film session, you must reserve that space through Eventive in advance.

Watershed Pass NOTE: If you do not arrive within 15 minutes from the start time and the theater is otherwise at capacity, your seat will no longer be considered reserved and will be opened up to attendees waiting in the "rush line" to buy last-minute tickets (unless you have a Watershed Pass).

#### What is a "Rush Line?"

When a session is sold out, we say that the session is "at rush." This means that last-minute tickets might be available 15 minutes before the session starts.

If you want to attend a session that is "at rush" (according to Eventive when you attempt to reserve), plan to arrive at the venue 30 minutes before and check with a volunteer to see if there are tickets available or if you need to wait in the "rush line" for a chance to buy last-minute tickets.

### I really want to see a certain film. How can I make sure I get a spot?

Even with a pass, all in-person film session tickets must be reserved in advance. To ensure you will have a seat at a specific screening, we recommend you reserve your spot as soon as you decide on a session.

#### To see where a film is screening,

click on the Film Guide button at WSFF.Eventive.Org. Once you have selected the film you are interested in, you can find the list of when and where that film is screening under "Showings – select to order tickets:" Once you have found which Showing you would like to attend, click on the light blue Order Tickets button at the top of that film session's page. Don't forget to show up no less than 15 minutes early to ensure that your reserved seat isn't given away as a "no show reservation".

Looking for what is screening at a particular venue? Click on the Schedule button at WSFF.Eventive.org. Then click on the Filter Events button in the top right. You can then filter the schedule by venue by selecting the venue you'd like from the list.

### **Accessibility**

To increase the accessibility of our programming, all of our virtual sessions have the option to enable closed captions. All film venues are ADA accessible. Please reach out to a staff member at the venue if you require assistance. For ADA access to Oddfellows please stop by HQ at Seven Stars Gallery.

# How do I meet guest filmmakers & speakers?

One of the coolest things about Wild & Scenic is meeting the great people behind the films. This year, we will have various in-person events with guests in attendance, such as filmmaker Q&As, Coffee Talks, and more. Some of our filmmakers and special guests will also be facilitating panels and workshops at the Activist Center.





What is the Activist Center?

Sponsored by Earthjustice, the Activist Center takes place at the City Hall in Nevada City and serves as a hub of know-how and inspiration. Activists of all experience levels and passions can learn more about specific topics presented in the festival films and innovative ideas about how to make a lasting difference. Emphasizing our commitment to inspiring activism, we proudly offer these workshops and panels for FREE!

### **Virtual Screenings**

This year, we are offering a virtual component composed of 9 sessions. All films are available on demand so you can watch a session anytime during the virtual festival window (February 13-23, 2025).

NOTE: Geographic restrictions and ticket caps may limit the ability to unlock some sessions. Where applicable, this information will be noted within each session in the Virtual Catalog.

To access films, you must "unlock" that session within the **Virtual Catalog** once it becomes available. You may also "pre-order" a session to register before it becomes available. Once you have unlocked individual session tickets, visit the **My Tickets** page for a complete list of the film sessions you've pre-ordered or unlocked.

# I have slow internet! Can I still attend?

Our virtual platform, Eventive, offers adaptive bitrate streaming, meaning that the resolution will adjust based on your internet speeds. That said, it all depends on your provider and their speeds, so expect similar results to what you experience when streaming other videos online.



Aaron's drive to protect and improve the health of the West's watersheds led him to SYRCL. As the Executive Director, he works closely with the community, government, and private entities to develop, implement, and monitor restoration efforts across the Yuba River watershed.

**Angela Matano** loves film. From a very early age, movies transfixed her. For over twenty years she worked on programming and events at the Los Angeles film non-profit, Vidiots. She is entering her fourth year as the director of the Mendocino Film Festival and loves being able to bring a wide collection of independent films to an appreciative audience.

**Houghton Kinsman** works between Cape Town and Sacramento. His writing has appeared in *Frieze, Art South Africa, Contemporary,* and *Dazed and Confused* magazines. He works as Education Manager at the Crocker Art Museum and served previously as the Assistant to the Curator of Education at the Museum of Contemporary Art, North Miami.

Jeff Clark is one of the original founders of the Nevada City Film Festival and has been the captain of the festival's ship since 2001. In that same year, Jeff took ownership of the Magic Theatre (now the Onyx Theatre), which has established itself as one of the premier arthouse theatres in the region. Jeff lives by the quote by writer Henry Miller: "Art teaches nothing, except the significance of life."
